



I. ABRAHAM JUSTIFIED BY FAITH; NOT WORKS. (4:1-8)

"What then shall we say that Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh, has found? For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God."

I. ABRAHAM JUSTIFIED BY <u>FAITH</u>; NOT WORKS. (4:1-8) II. ABRAHAM JUSTIFIED <u>BEFORE</u> CIRCUMCISION. (4:9-12)

"How then was it [righeousness] credited?
While he was circumcised, or uncircumcised?
Not while circumcised, but while uncircumcised."



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III. ABRAHAM JUSTIFIED APART FROM L<u>AW</u>. (4:13-16)

"For the promise to Abraham or to his descendants that he would be heir of the world was not through the Law, but through the righteousness of faith."

"Sin":

anything that goes against God's revealed character

"Trangression":

"overstepping" a clearly revealed law or command



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"In hope against hope he believed, so that he might become a father of many nations according to that which had been spoken, "So shall your descendants be."
